# Garth Newel Piano Quartet in Portugal TOUR SCHEDULE

- WEDNESDAY, September 27, 2023 Lisbon (Day 1)—This is your arrival day to get settled in and rested up at Lisbon's Eurostars Hotel Aurea Museum. This 5-star property on the banks of the Tagus River boasts an archaeological exhibition that will guide you through the different eras that define the city's identity today—from the Roman occupation and the Islamic invasions to the beginning of voyages searching for a new world. Modern facilities include an indoor pool, restaurant, massage room and Turkish bath.
- THURSDAY, September 28, 2023 | Lisbon (Day 2)—After breakfast in
  the hotel, we will explore the historical downtown of Lisbon, a quarter
  reconstructed after the great earthquake of 1755.
   The Marquis of Pombal, a central figure in the Portuguese Enlightenment, led

The Marquis of Pombal, a central figure in the Portuguese Enlightenment, led the redevelopment project, an early exercise in city planning. The restrained classicism known as the "Pombaline" style is characteristic of the district.

We will visit the magnificent gilded **São Roque Church** with the **Chapel of St. John the Baptist**, a masterpiece of 18th c. Italian art specially commissioned for this location. It is one of the richest chapels in the world.

The morning will also include a visit to the **National Theatre of São Carlo**. Lisbon's historic opera house was inspired by great Italian theatres like the San Carlo of Naples and La Scala in Milan.

Now within an easy walk to our hotel, we will break for lunch on our own. The afternoon is free for an easy stroll through the district to return to the hotel, or you may choose an alternative specialist visit:

For those interested in the history of Portuguese tile art, you can choose to visit the **Museu Nacional Do Azulejos**. Transportation provided.

We will end our first tour day with a **Welcome Dinner** at a restaurant a short walk from the hotel.

FRIDAY, September 29, 2023 | Lisbon (Day 3) — After breakfast, our morning visit takes us away from the busy downtown to the late 17th c.
 Fronteira Palace, home of the Marquesses des Fronteiras. Located near the entrance to Monsanto Park, the palace is noted for its collection of tiles decorating various rooms, rococo ornamentation, as well as the Baroque statuary, fountains, and tiles in its harmoniously conceived garden.
 Lunch on your own.

Our afternoon will take us into the **Belém Quarter**, where Portugal's key role in setting of the Age of Discovery is commemorated. Most prominent of the sites on our tour are the **Belém Tower**, the **Discoveries Monument** (1960) and the **Jerónimos Monastery and Cloister**.

One of the first monuments in Europe to be listed as a World Heritage Site, this monastery was built in the 1500s, paid for with the profits made in the spice trade with the East. The resident monks, of the Order of Saint Jerome, were supposed to pray for the king's soul. They were also responsible for the recipe of the famous custard tarts (the "pastéis de Belém" or "pastéis de nata").

The church features tree-trunk-like columns that seem to grow into the ceiling, and it holds the **tomb of explorer Vasco da Gama**. Its vaulting is considered one of the most extraordinary examples of the technology of Gothic architecture in Europe in a style called "Manueline," a Portuguese Gothic that developed under the reign of King Manuel I.

The entire monastery is a remarkable masterpiece of **Manueline architecture**, with ornamentation mixing naturalistic elements and religious and royal symbols. It glorifies the Age of Discovery, Portugal's power at sea, and its contact with distant lands. Coral, sea monsters and ropes are sculpted in the **magnificent cloisters**, which are unlike any other in the world.

The Belém Quarter is clearly a good place to sample the monks' famous custard tart – the "pastel de nata."

**Fado Dinner** —Our day reaches a perfect ending with a dinner where the melancholic sounds of **Fado**, the traditional Portuguese music, resonate through the room. A music style designated by UNESCO as an "Intangible Cultural Heritage," *fado* reflects the Portuguese mentality and expresses feelings of passion and love.

• SATURDAY, September 30, 2023 | Lisbon, Tomar (Day 4) This morning we check out of our Lisbon hotel.

Our first visit of the day takes us to the **Gulbenkian Museum** and Foundation, housing the vast collection of industrialist and art collector Calouste Gulbenkian.

The story behind this collection is nearly as astounding as the collection itself, given that Gulbenkian was Armenian, with British citizenship, and at times significant portions of the collection were in London, Europe, and the National Gallery in Washington. The collection is historically and artistically broad: works of Egyptian, Greek, Roman, Islamic and Asian art, as well as European works by the likes of Rembrandt and Monet.

We will have lunch on our own in the Gulbenkian café.

## **Garth Newel Piano Quartet Concert**

The Quartet's first concert will take place in the **Convento dos Cardeaes**. This 17th c. convent survived the great earthquake of 1755 and preserves its original baroque and rococo interior.

The church also features a notable altarpiece from 1693, which is **one of the finest examples of gilded wood carving in Lisbon**. This blending of gilt and blue-and-white tile panels is typical of Portuguese baroque, and this is one of the most significant and best-preserved examples in the city. Following the concert, we will travel north to Tomar where we will lodge at the **Hotel dos Templários**. After check-in, Cristina will lead us on an orientation walk to our dinner near the hotel.

• SUNDAY, October 1, 2023 | Tomar, Óbidos (Day 5) — In Tomar, our visit to the Convent of Christ will introduce us to a series of historical events starting with its founding by the Templar Knights, but evolving in purpose and design with the changing military, political, religious, and aesthetic developments over 500 years.

Notably we will visit the **Renaissance cloister**, deemed the best Renaissance design in Portugal, as well as the masterwork of the Manueline style, the **Window of the Chapter House**. Its sculpted stonework of ropes, coral, and vegetation is singular in its architectural impact.

At midday, we will visit the walled medieval town of **Óbidos**, where the whitewashed houses decorated with flowers are immediately enchanting. We will be free for lunch in Obidos. In the afternoon we will explore the

imposing **Batalha Monastery**, distinguished for its unfinished chapels. We will have dinner together at the hotel in Tomar.

MONDAY, October 2, 2023 | Coimbra, Porto (Day 6)
University of Coimbra (est. 1290) — Today we visit Coimbra, site of
Portugal's oldest university. In 2013 UNESCO designated the university
a World Heritage Site, noting its role in the development of higher
education in the Portuguese-speaking world, as well as its architecture
and traditions. Of special note is the Joanina Library, one of the crownjewels of the Portuguese baroque period and home to a large library of
early works.

#### **Garth Newel Piano Quartet Concert**

A downtown walk will be followed by lunch and the second concert by the Garth Newel Piano Quartet. Both take place at the **Quinta das Lagrimas**, a charming hotel within an 18th century palace. It was in the 14th c. manor house here that the crown Prince Pedro and Inês de Castro carried on their ill-fated love affair.

Following the concert, we will continue to Porto where we will check into the 5-star **Hotel Pestana Porto** – **A Brasileira** followed by dinner in the hotel.

• TUESDAY, October 3, 2023 Douro Valley Pinhão (Day 7)
Today we will drive to the Douro River Valley to embark on a cruise in a traditional Portuguese Rabelo boat, once used to transport wine from the Douro Valley to the wine caves in Porto. Through the colorful Douro Valley, we will view the great variety of terraced landscapes and the high cliffs that add great drama to this important wine region.

Our five senses will be spoiled during a special "farm-to-table" lunch at the **Quinta do Portal**, a 5th generation family-owned fine winemaker. The vibrant cuisine will be paired with Quinta do Portal wines in a relaxed and informal environment overlooking the Pinhão Valley vineyards.

Afterwards we will explore Quinta do Portal's wine cellars (designed by Pritzker Prize-winning architect Alvero Siza Vieira) where their premium Port wines, fortified Moscatel wines and olive oil are stored.

Of course, we will also enjoy tasting three of this winery's production! Dinner on your own in Porto.

WEDNESDAY, October 4, 2023 | Porto (Day 8)—Porto, a Baroque city, is rich in architecture and historical monuments, like the Stock Exchange Palace. During our walk we see picturesque shops, pubs, and markets, enchanting us with their flavors and history.

In Porto we will also be immersed in the Portuguese tile tradition—the azulejos. As an alternative to the expensive tapestries that decorated churches, palaces and other rich halls, Portugal began to employ painted tiles to depict important events in its history as well as to provide decoration. Among others we will visit the best example of azulejos—the **São Bento** train station beautifully covered in historical scenes painted in tile. Lunch on your own at the river bank Ribeira.

#### **Garth Newel Piano Quartet Concert**

In the later afternoon we will visit the **Museu Romantico** which recreates a nineteenth-century aristocratic house. Here the Garth Newel Piano Quartet will provide tour guests with the third of its tour concerts (6:00 p.m.)

Following our private concert, we will visit the historic **Graham's Cellars**, built in 1890 on a hill in Vila Nova de Gaia with spectacular views over the Douro River—the historic center of Porto.

Our port wine tasting takes place in Graham's fully functioning 19th c. cellars where generations of wines have aged in some 3200 oak barrels. In this atmospheric, historic setting of pine beams and cast-iron pillars of the 19th c., we will enjoy our tasting. Dinner will follow in the cave restaurant.

• THURSDAY, October 5, 2023 Nazaré, Convent Alcobaça, Lisbon (Day 9) Nazaré's fame is based on its enormous waves for surfing--where one of the world's largest waves, 30 meters in height, was registered and surfed by the famous American surfer, Gareth McNamara. As a fishing village, Nazaré is also known for the fishermen's wives wearing their 7 layers of skirts. They are friendly, loud, good humored, and proud women who always seem to have a joke or story to tell. We will have lunch in Nazaré.

On our return trip to Lisbon, our tour takes us to Alcobaça, about 80 miles north of Lisbon. The **Alcobaça Monastery**, dating from the 12th century, was built by order of the first king of Portugal, D. Afonso Henriques. This great Monastery, the first Gothic building in Portugal, originally belonged to the Cistercian Order and was once one of the richest and most famous abbeys in all of Europe. Here we will see the exquisite Gothic tombs of real life lovers, D. Pedro and D. Inês de Castro. The effigies of these lovers lie feet to feet preserving a rich and poetic power.

Upon our return to Lisbon's Hotel Aurea Museum, we will have dinner at a restaurant close by the hotel.

• FRIDAY, October 6, 2023 | Sintra, Cascais (Day 10)—Everyone falls in love with the romantic town of Sintra, another World Heritage Site, with its fairy-tale palaces and mysterious landscape. Here we visit the National Palace of Sintra (also called the Sintra Town Palace) from the middle ages with the unmistakable silhouette formed by its two conical chimneys. The palace is an important example of the medieval royal palaces in Portugal, with beautiful tiling and painted ceilings.

Following lunch we will have a scenic ride to **Cascais** where a brief walking tour will introduce us to this charming and elegant harbor village. Finally, we head toward the Atlantic Ocean to the furthest western point of Europe, **Roca Cape**, where the sea winds promise to replenish our souls.

In the evening, our Farewell Dinner will take place at the private **Eça Queiroz literary club** in the historic center of Lisbon. Both Portuguese and foreign notables have visited the Circulo as guests or speakers, including Maurice Maeterlink and T. S. Eliot, both Nobel Prize for Literature winners, Graham Greene, and Gabriel Marcel. Musical entertainment will follow the dinner as we say our farewells.
